

Lots of useful information in every chapter, and those chapters cover pretty much everything your will find in North America, with the exception of large cervids like elk and moose, and some game birds like partridges and grouse. But they do include an aquatic section, and the chapter on turtles is especially useful. My only gripe? Not enough recipes.
